to attend	<b>Invitation to Students in Korea</b> the 16 <sup>+</sup> Asian Youth Forum in Seoul (Oct. 18 - 24, 2017)
WHAT:	A 1-week international youth conference that brings together college-aged students from across Asia for academic seminars and cross-cultural workshops.
WHY:	To promote international understanding, intercultural communication, and leadership skills through the medium of English-as-a-global-language.
WHO:	College students (age 18 – 25) from countries in Asia. Students should have a good proficiency in English and an interest in Asian peoples, cultures, and countries. National delegations are planned from Thailand, Japan, the Philippines, and elsewhere.
WHEN:	The 16th Asian Youth Forum will be a 1-week event from October 18 - 24, 2017.
WHERE:	AYF 16 will be held in Seoul, the dynamic capital of South Korea, as part of the KOTESOL - PAC 2017 conference held at Sookmyung Women's University.
COSTS:	<ul> <li>AYF participants will be required to pay two costs:</li> <li>(1) round-trip travel expenses from their homes to the AYF venue in Seoul</li> <li>(2) an AYF participation fee (to cover AYF program, meals and accommodation)</li> <li>(a) Full participants = 250,000 won (1 week program + dorm accommodation)</li> <li>(b) Commuters = 180,000 won (1 week program, no dorm, commute from home)</li> <li>* You may also apply to be volunteer staff (1 week; 150,000 won with dorm; 80,000 won, no dorm) or a weekend-only participant (Sat. &amp; Sun., 60,000 won)</li> </ul>
