If I am elected to the position of president, my intention for the coming year is to build on these successes and support KOTESOL’s forward momentum, with special consideration to how we can continue to support our members and enhance the membership experience. In particular, I’d like to expand our collaborations with other organizations, helping to ensure our members have opportunities to participate in the ELT knowledge ecosystem, engage with cutting-edge research, foster new connections, and discover novel teaching approaches. In conjunction with this aim, I hope to work with our second vice-president to rejuvenate the KOTESOL Teacher Training (KTT) program, restructuring it to proactively address a need for international teacher training programs while exploring how we can best buttress its current role providing trainers for local workshops. As ever, my intentions are underpinned by a desire to maintain a balance between fiscal responsibility and good value; to expand

and diversify our organization's visibility, reach, and offerings; to respond effectively and flexibly to changes in the world as well as trends in ELT and professional development; and to cultivate new leadership and renewed volunteerism in our organization. With these goals in mind, I am pleased to offer my services to our organization for the coming year.
